## Tips for interviewing children

## Principles for interviewing children

- We are adults with POWER and responsibilities
- As adults we have a duty of care to children because they are POWERLESS
- Each child is an individual person
- Children deserve to be treated with respect, and encouraged to speak for themselves
- Do no harm to children
- Be accurate check and double check
- Include the child's point of view, where possible
- Consider the consequences make sure children understand what they are doing
- Where possible, seek appropriate permissions

## Top tips for interviewing children

- 1. First, get the right permissions
- 2. Don't rush in give them time to decide if they want to talk
- 3. Use a location where THEY feel comfortable
- 4. Don't stand over then operate, literally, at their level
- 5. Explain WHY you want to talk to them, and HOW you intend to use what they say
- 6. Give them opportunities to ask questions and always answer honestly
- 7. Explain how your recording equipment works. Engage their interest let them see, touch, and use it.
- 8. Don't coax or bribe children to 'perform'.
- 9. Let them know how they can contact you later
- 10. If possible, make sure they will be able to see or hear what you produce.
